2002 Most Successful Eventing Season Ever on PEI

What a season it was! We started with a very productive cross country jump building clinic in May, and ended with record entries for the autumn Horse Trial at Strathgartney. All this would not be possible without the support of Island riders and volunteers. However, we must recognise the importance of NS and NB riders who supported our jumping clinic and both Horse Trials. We simply cannot exist in isolation from the rest of the Maritime eventing circuit. With the small population base we have to draw from, we must all work together to see the sport flourish in the Maritime region, and the NS and NB riders have certainly embraced Strathgartney as a key player on the regional eventing scene. Thank you to everyone for your support.

The Prince Edward Island Horse Council has also played a significant role in the development of the facility at Strathgartney Equestrian Park during 2002, which has allowed us to draw ever increasing numbers of competitors for our Horse Trials. The IHC Strathgartney committee led by Christin Campbell has worked wonders at the Equestrian Park this year. Thanks to their efforts we now have two rings which are superb in wet conditions. I think it is quite reasonable to say that without the ring improvements our autumn Horse Trial would not have been held. Hurricane Gustav dumped huge volumes of water on PEI in the days preceding our Horse Trial, but the footing in the rings was excellent on the Saturday of the competition. Combined with the routinely excellent footing on the cross country course we had conditions which absolutely amazed a NS rider who had come with huge corks for the day, but realized once she arrived that they were unnecessary.

The electricity allowed for computerized scoring, so Ian and Laura were able to have results posted very quickly with individual fence information for the cross country phase. You only have to ask Linda about the canteen facilities to know that this volunteer job is also much easier with the new building, water and electricity.

All this aside, successful seasons are built around programs which meet the needs of our horses and riders, so come out to our Annual General Meeting Friday Nov. 8 at the AVC faculty lounge to tell us what worked for you and help us plan for another great season in 2003.
